Traffic – it's the common denominator for Los Angeles. We all experience the frustration, expense and waste of time that traffic brings into our lives every day.

FAST is a non-profit organization dedicated to implementing short-term strategies to reduce traffic congestion in Los Angeles by optimizing our current transit infrastructure and expanding the use of public transit in order to improve our mobility and quality of life. To find out the most successful traffic reduction strategies, FAST, in conjunction with the Music Center and the LA County Metropolitan Transit Authority (Metro), commissioned a study to find out which short-term solutions would give us the biggest bang for our buck. With some inexpensive changes, we can get traffic flowing and get people to their destinations faster, and with less stress.
FAST is now working on a comprehensive corridor improvement study for Los Angeles. We want your input on which areas are the highest priorities for you, and what future traffic reduction solutions are most important to your community.
