Call for Candidates

January 9, 2018

– For a Vacant Seat on the Board of the HCNC –
Position of “**Solano Canyon Business Owner Representative**”

Eligibility to Run for the Seat: “Stakeholder who is a business owner (and can provide an exact address) within the Solano Canyon geographical area and who is 15 years or older.”

In the event of a community representative seat vacancy, that vacancy shall be filled by a candidate to be nominated by his or her specific community representatives on the board (the community caucus: defined as the board members elected specifically as resident, business owner or non-profit from any one of the six communities that comprise the HCNC) according to the procedures listed below. The candidate will be voted onto the board by a majority vote of the HCNC Board Members present at a regular board meeting, whereby he or she will complete the term of the vacated board seat.

1. Public Notices announcing the call for appropriately qualified candidates will be posted at the sites designated for posting HCNC notices in the neighborhoods in which the vacant seats occur. Candidate application forms will be made available via mail and e-mail from the HCNC Executive Council.

2. Candidates are required to submit their candidate application forms to the HCNC Executive Council no later than 25 days after the Call for Candidates is publicly posted.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 3, 2018

3. Board members representing each individual community (community caucuses) will vote within their caucus for the candidates from their neighborhood. The candidate who receives a majority of the vote of the caucus members will be recommended to the full board. In the event of a tie vote among members of a caucus, the full board will vote on the candidates.
